The Details of Your Journey

Training Start Date:

July 1, 2026 (to align with the academic year, though start dates are flexible and negotiable).

Duration:

One year, with the option to extend to a second year.

Stipend Availability:

- Your updated Curriculum Vitae (CV)



- Copies of your MD and specialty certificate (or a letter of good standing for Canadian residents in their last year)
- A personal letter of intent outlining your passion and your career aspirations.
- Contact information for three references who know you well (one must be your Residency Program Director)

Application Period:

For a **July 1, 2026** start date, applications will be accepted between **September 1, 2025, and December 1, 2025** (negotiable). Applications are submitted via the Psychiatry Fellowship Program's application platform.
