What is Faculty Development?

Faculty Development is any planned activity that facilitates growth and success in a faculty member's academic roles, activities, and career trajectory. "Academic" specifically refers to the Department of Psychiatry's academic mission in education, research, and creative professional activity. Thus, Faculty Development, with its focus on academic knowledge and skills, is distinguished from Continuing Professional Practice Development and Continuing Education, which focus on clinical knowledge and skills and other aspects of clinical practice).

Why do Faculty Development?

To be a successful faculty, it is important to continuously expand and improve one's academic knowledge and skills in the same way as a successful clinician would continuously expand and improve their clinical knowledge and skills.

Department of Psychiatry Faculty Development Events



Donald Wasylenki Education Day

- this is a one-day event, typically occurring in February, that focuses on knowledge and skills in teaching and education

Orientation Day for New Faculty

- this annual fall event is geared towards faculty within their first 3 years of appointment
- it focuses on providing an overview of core academic knowledge and skills, including basic knowledge and skills for faculty starting in teaching and supervision roles

Centre for Faculty Development Workshops for Psychiatry Teachers and Educators

- inaugural program offered in partnership with the Centre for Faculty Development
- workshop series customized for psychiatry teachers and educators
- offers education career development curriculum aligned with our department's strategic plan (ie. focusing on EDI, mentorship, wellness)
- opportunity to join a community of practice to facilitate academic collaborations, scholarship, and sharing of resources
- offers flexible and adaptive curriculum designed in response to emerging faculty needs

Community of Practice/Mentorship Group for Clinician Teachers

- inaugural program launched in June 2022
- this community meets monthly, with the content determined in response to faculty needs
- Topic areas include:
 - Choosing and maintaining a career pathway
 - Negotiation, choosing priorities/options, and self-advocacy skills
 - Programs and opportunities to develop teaching skills
 - Promotion pathways, including tips for success and how to put together a dossier
 - Effectively supporting trainees
 - Processing and managing negative evaluations
 - Addressing issues of equity, diversity, and inclusion in teaching
 - Wellness and establishing a network for support & shared reflection

STACER Examination Module: A Self-Directed Course for Examiners

- this inaugural offering for this training is in a self-paced, e-module format to make it accessible to faculty on demand
- participants receive a certificate of completion
- additional resources have been developed to support faculty knowledge and skills as an examiner (ie. FAQ and STACER Examiner Tip Sheet)
- the module is accessible via Quercus, please contact facdevcppd.psych@utoronto.ca
- Course content includes: introduction, psychometrics for STACER examiners, STACER procedures, passing standards (vignettes), final quiz, and resources.



Promotion Primer

- this is a half-day event, typically occurring in late November, that focuses on informing faculty on the process of promotion and how to prepare their materials for successful promotion

TIDE Unconscious Bias Training

- this training supports the professional development of our faculty and aims to improve our understanding of unconscious bias and the role that it plays in clinical practice, education, and research
- all full-time (clinical and status-only) faculty members in the Department of Psychiatry are strongly encouraged to complete this training

Department of Psychiatry Mentorship Program

The Department of Psychiatry values mentorship given its role in career development, career satisfaction and wellness. It is strongly recommended to have **at least one primary mentor**, particularly in the first five years of appointment. The Department is committed to assisting each faculty to find a primary mentor and also offers a number of mentorship groups or communities of practice to support development for specific academic roles or for peer support related to identity.

Faculty Mentorship Groups

The Department organizes mentorship groups/communities of practice related to a faculty's social identity or background. The mentorship groups are co-led by two facilitators, typically a mid-career/senior and junior faculty member. Groups collaboratively determine their goals and meeting formats through member input.

- Clinician Scientists & Investigators
 - *Topics include "Promotion on the Research Track"; "Hiring a High-Performing Research Team"; Dealing with Rejection"; topics related to grantmanship, "The Joy of Clinical Trials" and ways to support roles in leadership.*
- Clinician Teachers
 - *Topics include "Identity as a Clinician Teacher"; "Dealing with Negative Evaluation from Learners; "Supporting Trainees with Accommodations". This group also provides networking opportunity with other clinician teachers.*
- International Medical Graduates (IMGs)
 - *This mentorship group brings together International Medical Graduates who often feel isolated and learning about the Canadian health care system and career pathways. Topics include "Academic Promotion"; "Transitioning from an academic to independent license"*
- 2SLGBTQ+ Mentorship Group
 - *The group offers networking opportunities and peer support to foster academic career advancement and foster a sense of belonging while navigating social identity. Its key aims include reducing isolation and the sharing of strategies in working with an academic system.*
- Status-Only (PhDs and other non-MD) Faculty Mentorship Group
 - *This mentorship group brings together our non-MD faculty and provides opportunities for networking and sharing of experiences/strategies of faculty working within a system where the majority of faculty are MDs. Topics include "Hiring a High-Performing Research Team"; "Promotions, Teaching Evaluations and Academic Scholar Grants"; "Building Identity and Career as Status-Only" and topics related to leadership.*
- Uplifting Women & Underrepresented Genders in Academia (UPWURD)
 - *This mentorship group brings together women and underrepresented faculty. The group provides added psychosocial support and opportunities for networking as well as the sharing of strategies in navigating within an academic system. Topics explored include: "Addressing Microaggressions", "Work-Life Balance: Everything you Wanted to Know but were Afraid to Ask"; "Self-Advocacy and Personal Career Building Strategies".*

- Quality, Innovation, and Safety (QIS) Mentorship Group
 - *This mentorship group is focused on supporting faculty who are interested in building their academic careers in QIS*
 - *Individuals who are engaging in QIS work or interested in learning more about this academic pathway, are encouragement and welcome to attend. Topics explored include: “Getting Started in QIS Work”, “Advanced Training Opportunities in QIS”, “How to Choose a Project Focus”, “Funding for QIS Work”, “Program Evaluation vs QI vs Research”*
- Racialized Women’s Faculty Mentorship Group
 - *This mentorship group is focused on the needs of faculty who identify as racialized women. This initiative is meant to supplement the broader mentorship group for women and underrepresented genders, UPWURD. Individuals who identify as racialized women are welcomed and encouraged to attend both the larger women's mentorship group, and this smaller group, if interested.*
