
Fellowship in Mental Health in Ambulatory Geriatrics and in Respiratory Disease

This 1-year (renewable) fellowship will focus on the assessment, diagnosis and management of mental health conditions in community dwelling older adults with an emphasis on the collaborative care management of co-occurring physical and mental health in the respiratory population. Two half-days will be at the CAMH Geriatric Mental Health Outpatient Services. Two days/week of training will be at West Park Healthcare Centre Respiratory Medicine providing mental health consultations and follow-up. Two days will be dedicated to academic activities including a collaborative project between CAMH and West Park Healthcare Centre and related to mental health in respiratory diseases. This fellowship is open to domestic applicants who have or are completing a residency in general psychiatry and international applicants who have acquired certification as psychiatry specialists. Interest in collaborative care is an asset.

Fellowship start date:

July 1 of each academic year is preferred but fellows will be accepted on case-by-case basis.

Funding availability:

This fellowship will be supported by hospital funds with an expected stipend of \$80,000 per year.

Selection Process

Application requirements:

CV, 3 reference letters, personal statement, MD & specialty certificate (or residency letter of good standing indicating expected graduation date), MD transcript, sent to: tarek.Rajji@camh.ca

Application deadline:

Applications will be reviewed on a rolling basis. However, candidates must apply well in advance of the prospective start date, to accommodate the additional university registration timelines noted below. Domestic/international candidates are encouraged to apply to this opportunity 6 months/1 year in advance of the prospective start date, respectively.

Note: Selected candidates will have to secure a clinical fellowship appointment with the University of Toronto's Psychiatry Fellowship Program to pursue this training.
