Calling all PGY1s...

The best way to prepare for your very first competence committee review is to...

• Aim to complete your TTD1 and TTD2 requirements before October 18. The Committee would like to progress PGY1s from the TTD stage to Foundations.

• Don't forget you can attempt EPAs during Off-service rotations!

We recommend that you focus on the off-service EPA **FOD1**: Assessing, diagnosing and participating in the management of patients with medical presentations relevant to psychiatry. We have created rotation cards and an EPA Map to help guide on you on the EPAs you are more likely to attempt or encounter on a specific rotation.

Remember, any EPA can be attempted on any rotation!

? EPA FAQs

Q: Do all the milestones in an EPA need to be addressed at the time of an encounter?

A: No – if a resident is entrusted with an EPA then it is assumed that the component milestones are achieved. If a resident receives an overall entrustment rating of Intervention, Direction or Support on an EPA, the assessor can use the milestones to help unpack the EPA and flag potential areas of improvement.

Q: How do I determine if a resident is entrustable with the EPA they just attempted?

A: We recommend using two key measures to determine entrustability:

•Can the resident complete the task competently (safely, not perfectly or excellently)?

• Can the resident complete this task alone? i.e. You would have felt comfortable leaving the resident entirely on their own to complete the task
