⁶ **COPE Exam** is offered once a year and has typically occurred in the Fall but the timing of the exam is subject to change.

⁷ **PGY2 STACER Requirements:** 4 practice STACERs + 1 successful General STACER. Practice STACERs are arranged at the core rotation sites throughout the year except during the Child and Adolescent rotation. The General STACER is typically scheduled between April-May. Residents should connect with their Site Director to arrange practice STACERs.

⁸ **PGCorEd Modules**: most be completed before the end of PGY2.
